

Did you know????

South Carolina is one of the earliest states to mark historical sites with a marker, beginning in 1936. There are over 1700 markers placed throughout S.C. I know riding our motorcycles on many roads we see them dotted along the sides of the roads. Unfortunately, we are usually going to fast to read much that is written on them, and rarely is there a place you can get of the road to stop and read about that site. Most are erected after petition by a group or individual

32-9 LEE'S TAVERN SITE E. COLUMBIA AVE. (U.S. HWY. 1), LEESVILLE Mills' Atlas of 1820 shows this site on the Augusta-Columbia road as the location of John W. Lee's Stage Tavern. According to local tradition, this vicinity was the probable site of President George Washington's breakfast stop on May 22, 1791. The Town of Leesville derives its name from the family of John W. Lee, who were early settlers of this area. Erected by Lexington County Historical Society, 197

32-32 SALUDA FACTORY CEMETERY BOTANICAL LN., WEST COLUMBIA This cemetery, thought to contain graves of supervisors and workers in the post-Civil War community of Saludaville, includes 31 marked graves and between 525 and 900 total burials. The Saluda Factory was a modest success before the war and was burned by Union troops in 1865. Rebuilt as the Saluda Manufacturing Company in 1974, it employed about 100 workers before it burned in 1884. Erected by the South Carolina Electric & Gas Company and the Mungo Company, 200

32-43 BLINDING OF ISAAC WOODARD WEST CHURCH ST. NEAR FULMER ST., BATESBURG-LEESVILLE (Front) Sgt. Isaac Woodard, a black soldier, was removed from a bus in Batesburg and arrested on Feb. 12, 1946, after a dispute with the bus driver. Woodard was beaten and blinded by a town police officer and the next day convicted in town court for "drunk and disorderly." The incident led Harry Truman to form a Council on Civil Rights and issue Executive Order 9981, which desegregated the U.S. Armed Forces in 1948. (Reverse) The police officer was charged with violating Woodard's civil rights but was acquitted by an all-white jury. The result troubled the presiding judge, J. Waties Waring, who would go on to issue landmark civil rights rulings, including a dissent in Briggs v. Elliott (1952), which became a model for Brown v. Board of Education (1954). In 2018 a judge, on the town's motion, expunged Woodard's conviction. Sponsored by the Sgt. A Route 50 Adventure - Part II

On July 2nd we left Route 66 and headed for Route 50 westbound! We skirted around the bottom of St. Louis to avoid the city, crossed the mighty Mississippi River into Missouri and rode through the farmland toward Kansas City. Route 50 runs along the south side of KC, which helped us avoid city driving again, and hooks up with I-35. We found an Army Corps of Engineers campground by a lake for \$16.407 miles for



the day.



Next day we packed up early and headed for Dodge City as that was on John's list of things to see. They say that crossing Kansas is flat and boring. Well, I never see any road as boring. Even the same road every day is different. On the way into Dodge, we rode along a windmill farm that stretched for 20 miles and kept going past the city. Guess it gets mighty windy there!

On the way into town, we stopped at a scenic overlook and were surprised by what we saw, a HUGE feedlot full of cattle! We knew Dodge was a Cowtown but weren't prepared for this sight. According to the sign more than 10.000 cattle get processed into beef products EVERY DAY! That is a lot of hamburgers!

We then went looking for the old Dodge City and Boot Hill. John was disappointed because old Dodge only exists in a museum replica and Boot Hill cemetery was moved twice to build a building in its place. The city is now an industrial complex for the beef industry which feeds the world. Our Camp for the night was at Gunsmoke Campground with 296 miles for the day.



The next day we spent July 4th riding in western Kansas and eastern Colorado. In the east we are used to seeing large areas of forest, but the middle part of the country is wide open. This is where the grain, hav and cattle that feeds everyone comes from. Small towns with hard working farmers and ranchers are the backbone of this great country.

We finally entered the foothills of the Rocky Mountains. This is where we saw a river run uphill! For some reason when we

were following the Arkansas River along Rt 50 even though the road went up hill it looked like it went down and that made the river look like it was flowing uphill. After a lively conversation with the locals in a restaurant they pointed us to a campground up the road.

We camped at Monarch Spur Campground which had very friendly owners and gave us a deal on a site. 404 miles for the day.
