Skills Training

As we approach the New Year now is a good time to think about brushing up on some of your riding skills. As we age, and as the weather gets colder and we ride less, our riding skills get rusty. Add to the fact that the most training that we had when starting riding was "here is the throttle, here is the clutch, here is the shifter and here is the rear brake. Don't use the front brake because it will put you over the handlebars ". How did we ever survive this long with training like that?

Now with cooler weather here it is a good time to find a vacant lot and do some practice. Even a short ride to a lot to do some practice gets you out on the bike. Any ride is a good ride!

There are several places to get ideas for training. The EWMA website has many parking lot diagrams to set up practice. YouTube has many videos, type in 'motorcycle training'. Ride Like a Pro Jerry Palladino has many good videos as well as others to get ideas from. And if any Chapter would like and can find a lot to use, I can look at setting up a PLP, Parking Lot Practice.

I have noticed that my U-turns aren't as smooth as they used to be. So, it's time for me to go to the local school that has a good lot and spend some time honing my skills to be ready for nice weather riding. Remember "practice makes perfect".
