

Riding Smart: Avoiding the Blind Spot

As motorcyclists, we are acutely aware of the challenges that come with being on two wheels in a world designed for four. One of the most dangerous situations we can encounter on the road is when we're caught in a vehicle's blind spot. The consequences can be severe if we're not vigilant about positioning ourselves for visibility and safety. In this month's newsletter, we're focusing on how to avoid riding in blind spots and why it's essential for your safety. *What is a Blind Spot?*

A vehicle's blind spot is the area around the vehicle that the driver cannot see through mirrors or peripheral vision. Blind spots vary in size depending on the vehicle—larger vehicles

like trucks and SUVs often have more expansive blind spots compared to smaller cars. As riders, it's critical to understand that these blind spots are a serious risk to us. When drivers can't see us, they may make maneuvers that can lead to accidents.

How to Stay Out of Blind Spots

1. **Position Yourself Wisely** Always try to position yourself where the driver can see you. If you're in the lane next to a car, make sure you're slightly ahead or behind the vehicle, never directly beside it for extended periods. This will ensure the driver has a better chance of noticing you in their mirrors.

2. **Use Your Headlight** While daytime running lights are standard on many motorcycles, make sure your headlight is on at all times, even in daylight. A well-lit motorcycle is easier to spot, especially when drivers are scanning their mirrors.

3. **Avoid Tailgating** If you're riding directly behind a vehicle, make sure you maintain a safe distance. Not only does this give you a buffer in case of sudden braking, but it also ensures you are visible in the driver's side and rearview mirrors. Staying too close to a vehicle puts you in a vulnerable position if they change lanes unexpectedly.

4. **Use Lane Positioning to Your Advantage** Within your lane, position yourself where you're visible to drivers, but avoid being in a position where you're riding directly in a blind spot. For example, riding in the left part of your lane when you're behind a car can help ensure you're seen by the driver.

5. **Signal Early and Clearly** Whether you're changing lanes or preparing to turn, always signal your intentions well in advance. This gives drivers ample time to notice you and adjust their driving accordingly.

6. **Be Aware of Larger Vehicles** Trucks and buses have particularly large blind spots. Never linger in these areas and be extra cautious when passing them. If you find yourself next to one, accelerate or decelerate to move out of the blind spot as quickly as possible.

7. **Make Eye Contact When Possible** Making eye contact with drivers at intersections or while waiting at lights can help establish awareness. If the driver acknowledges you, they are more likely to be conscious of your presence when they begin moving.

What to Do If You Find Yourself in a Blind Spot

Despite your best efforts, you might still find yourself in a blind spot from time to time. If this happens:

- Don't Panic: Stay calm and avoid doing anything sudden.
- **Change Positions**: Safely move ahead, behind, or to the other side of the vehicle, ensuring you are no longer in the blind spot.
- **Be Ready to React**: Stay aware of the vehicle's movements and be prepared to act if they change lanes or make a turn unexpectedly.

Final Thoughts

Being proactive about your positioning on the road is the best way to stay safe and avoid dangerous blind spot situations. While we can't always predict what other drivers will do,

we can always control how we position ourselves on the road and how visible we are to

others. Ride smart, stay aware, and remember: safety is always in your hands. Safe riding,
